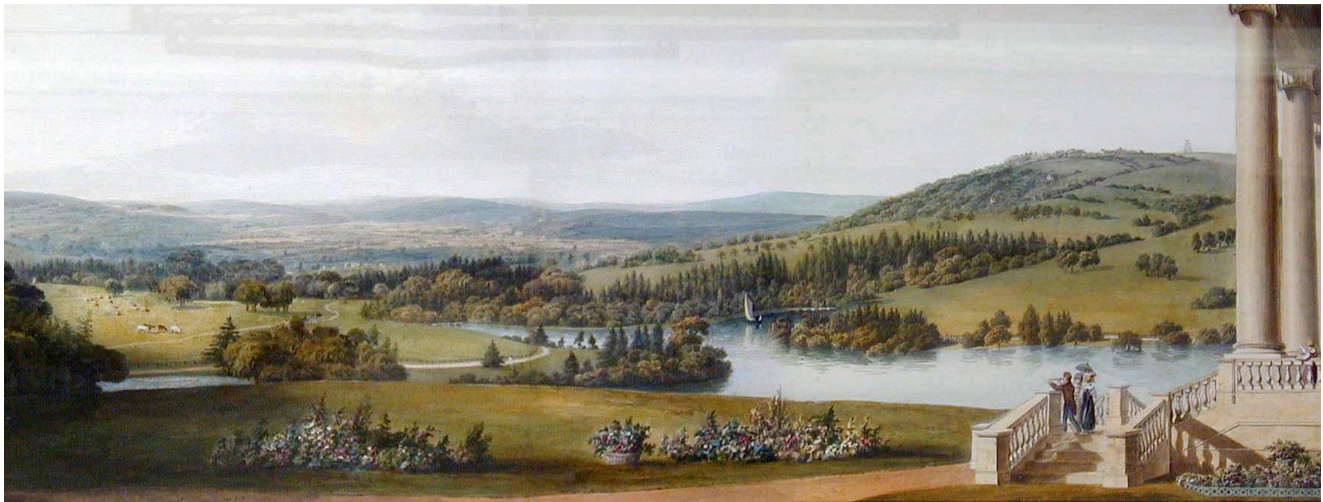

The National Botanic Garden of Wales is of international importance and has attracted over two million visitors since it opened in 2000. Set in the historic grounds of *Middleton Hall*, it features new garden design, scientific and educational work, centred on the iconic Great Glasshouse designed by Sir Norman Foster.

The wider estate landscape comprises an important Regency park created for William Paxton, recorded in detail by Thomas Hornor, as well as the archaeology of a Stuart-period house, gardens and landscape around the site of *Old Middleton Hall*, and a National Nature Reserve.

The Regency Restoration Project focuses on the two lower great lakes, parkland restoration and planting, and pathways to extend visitor access. Proposals respond to a series of detailed archaeological, ecological and geotechnical appraisals needed to secure consents to reinstate two 'reservoirs' under the new Flood and Water Management Act, with works now approaching completion.
